Prepare a Will

A Will helps to ensure your assets will be distributed according to your wishes when you die. Even if you think you don't have much, it is still important to make a Will.

Dying without a Will

If you don't have a valid Will, the law sets out which of your family members are entitled to your assets when you die. This may not be what you want to happen. For example, the law does not include gifts to friends or charities and there is no provision made for pets.

Choosing an executor

An executor administers your estate and carries out your wishes after you die. You may see it as a compliment to appoint a family member or friend as your executor, but the role can be demanding. An executor needs an understanding of the law, tax rules and they may need to resolve conflict between beneficiaries. They can also be held personally liable for any mistakes that are made in the administration of the estate.

Don't do-it-yourself

Do-it-yourself Will kits are not a good idea because anyone who is not legally qualified risks making a mistake or creating uncertainty with unclear wording. Questions about whether a Will is valid have to be decided by the Supreme Court and can result in large costs and delays.

Keep your Will up-to-date

If you already have a Will, think about whether it is time to update it so it reflects your current circumstances. Situations where you may want to update your Will include:

- buying a house
- marriage
- separation or divorce
- big travel plans
- welcoming a child
- retirement
- health concerns
- change of beneficiary/ executor
- death of a loved one/ coming into inheritance

Make a Power of Attorney and Enduring Guardianship

If something happens to you while you are alive and you no longer have the ability to make decisions for yourself, Power of Attorney and Enduring Guardianship documents can be used to provide for your financial and lifestyle decisions.

Your attorney, appointed under a Power of Attorney, can manage your assets and make decisions about your finances like paying bills and managing investments. An attorney can also sign legal documents for you.

Your appointed enduring guardian can make health and lifestyle decisions for you. For example, your enduring guardian can make choices about where you live and the services you receive such as healthcare.

It is important to choose an attorney and enduring guardian carefully as they are in a position of trust and have a responsibility to act in your best interests.

Will Safe storage

Many people store their Will at home where it can be stolen, lost or damaged. If a Will cannot be located when required, it could cost the estate thousands of dollars. There is also a serious risk your assets will not be distributed as you would have intended because the court may decide that you didn't have a Will.

NSW Trustee & Guardian's Will Safe is a secure place to store your Will, Power of Attorney and Enduring Guardianship documents and they are easy to access when needed.

Video conference appointments for Wills

Please follow carefully the witnessing requirements to ensure the document is correctly signed and witnessed.

Planning ahead checklist

This checklist will help you think about what to consider before drafting your planning ahead documents.

Will

- Instructions for funeral arrangements.
- Details of your beneficiaries.
- Decide who to appoint as your executor(s).
- Guardians for your children.
- Arrangements for pets.
- A summary of your assets, including real estate, bank accounts, superannuation and investments.
- Gifts to organisations or charities.

Power of Attorney

- The person, people or organisation you want to appoint as your attorney, to make financial and legal decisions for you.

Enduring Guardianship

- The person or people you want to appoint as your enduring guardian, to make health and lifestyle decisions for you.

Decision-making areas your guardian(s) will have authority over, and any specific directions.

Document storage

- Decide where to safely store all of your planning ahead documents so they can be easily retrieved when needed.
